We raised more than £885,000
to bring the latest cancer
treatments to Scotland.

Every year more than 100 children are treated
in wards 2A and 2B – known to many as
the Schiehallion wards – for cancer
and blood disorders.


Sadly, despite the heroic efforts of the
Schiehallion team, not all children will respond
to treatment. For these children, clinical trials
can be a lifeline – but until now, were often
only available in highly specialised centres
in England.

Last year, Professor Brenda Gibson OBE asked
for your help to expand the Schiehallion Clinical
Trials Centre in Glasgow by supporting our
Schiehallion Appeal.

The money raised has enabled Professor Gibson
and her team to achieve their vision of creating
a leading Clinical Trials Centre. Now, fewer
children and families will have to travel down
south for treatment, and can be treated in the
hospital they know, by their own doctors and
nurses. You took the children of Schiehallion
to your hearts, and far surpassed our hopes of
raising £500,000. The additional funds raised
will help Professor Gibson as she continues to
develop the Schiehallion Clinical Trials Centre,
and bring the very latest cancer treatments to
Scotland for years to come.

New Service

Helping Families Cope with Loss

Our new Bereavement Service helps families rebuild their lives following the death of a child.

For parents, the death of a child is simply unimaginable. For some, it can become a tragic reality.

We are proud to have launched a new Bereavement Service with NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde, providing structured support to parents, siblings and staff who are affected by the death of a child.

The new service costs £110,000 per year, and provides immediate and long-term support to families. Delivered by specialist Bereavement Support Practitioners from Child Bereavement UK, the service is open to anyone who has been affected by the loss of a child. Together with your support, we hope to continue funding this vital service in the future.

It is our ambition that no child should ever be lonely or scared in hospital. During even the darkest and most difficult moments, our very special team of play staff and volunteers create joyful memories for children and their families.

Each year we fund an extensive programme of play and events at the hospital, ensuring that every child has the opportunity to laugh, play and enjoy their childhood, regardless of their condition.

Our funding includes the provision of 12 play workers, 11 fully stocked inpatient play rooms, MediCinema, the Teddy Hospital and Kitten Scanner, twice weekly visits from the Clowndoctors, Zone 12, and a full calendar of fun events. None of this would be possible without your donations.

Cuddles in Intensive Care

The way children recover in Intensive Care has been transformed, thanks to special equipment funded by Glasgow Children's Hospital Charity.

The past year has seen a transformation in the Intensive Care Unit, thanks to the pioneering MoVE project – the first of its kind in a children's hospital in the UK. MoVE stands for 'Move on Ventilation Early', and helps children to recover more quickly by getting them moving as soon as possible following their admission.

We are proud to have supported the MoVE project from its inception thanks to the Devenny Family Fund, and have funded special equipment that helps children take part in physical activity, even if they cannot leave their beds. The activity is not strenuous, and can be as simple as sitting up for a cuddle, or being taken for a short walk away from the ward.

"Thanks to Glasgow Children's Hospital Charity, we can give everyone a few wee moments of normality in an overwhelming environment. It's lovely to walk around the unit now and see things that you just wouldn't have seen a year ago. You see little ones up for cuddles, sitting up in chairs or being taken for a walk in the hospital grounds, instead of spending the whole day confined to their beds."

"It's great because the children get up sooner, and it's so reassuring for parents to see their little ones moving again."


Precious Moments in PICU

Family Support Services

Essential Support at a Critical Time

There are few moments in life as worrying as an emergency admission to hospital.

At these difficult times, families will often arrive at the hospital with nothing but the clothes on their back; lives are turned upside down in a heartbeat, and a new life in hospital begins.

We do all that we can during these critical moments to ensure that families receive the support they need.

From meal vouchers and toiletries, to help with travel and accommodation, the NHSGG&C Family Support and Information team helps to look after parents and carers, whose sole focus is their child.

This year we provided £681,162 of family support-related services. With more than 168,000 patient visits each year there is more demand than ever for this support; thanks to the generosity of our donors and fundraisers, we hope to be there for every family who needs our help this year.

For some families a hospital visit can become a long term stay, which can put a significant burden on their finances.

We are proud to have funded the Money and Debt Advice Service at the Royal Hospital for Children, which helps families access welfare support. Last year, the service claimed £2.4 million for 361 newly referred families – an average of £6,743.37 for every family supported.
