Wilma Ferguson whose granddaughter has been cared for at the Children's Hospital in Glasgow completed a 10,000 steps a day challenge in addition to other in store activities. The team raised an amazing £745.00

Morrisons Stewartfield, East Kilbride:

Raised money by raffling a tech hamper, made and sold chocolate bouquets, held a staff only bake sale and invited Jack, a customer and patient at the hospital to draw the raffle. The staff raised an incredible £1,870











Morrisons Paisley Anchormill:

The team dressed up as Super Hero's, took part in a sponsored cycle and also hosted a 'wear your pj's to work day'. An awesome £1,847 was raised

Morrisons Fort William:

The staff virtually walked the distance from Fort William to the Royal Hospital for Children, Glasgow and totaled 1.3 million steps along the way, raising £733

Staff held a raffle, and hosted a "dress as a superhero" day in store. Community Champion Nadia said, "Looking forward to restrictions easing so that we can do a lot more!"
















Morrisons - Community Champion Feedback

Thanks to Morrisons, ECHC can continue to support children like 3 year old Brodie, who was diagnosed with a brain tumour in 2019.

Brodie spent three months in the Royal Hospital for Sick Children, Edinburgh, for life-saving surgery and chemotherapy.

Brodie's Mum, Kirstie, says, "Brodie has a very long string of beads, funded by the charity. He is so proud of his 'beads of courage' as each bead represents a treatment and milestone. He and his sister Indiana always loved the arts and activities on the wards and would wait in anticipation for Rhys with his guitar - he even personalised a song just for Brodie and would treat him to his own personal concerts. These sessions always gave us something to look forward to.

"The Drop In Centre was also a lifesaver for our family. When Brodie was well enough, the four of us would pop over and collapse onto the sofa to watch a movie. We often went months without sitting on a sofa. Being able to just cuddle up together as a family at the Drop In was an essential part of Brodie's recovery and overall wellbeing.

"There were many ups and downs, many tears and challenges to overcome, but Brodie always enjoyed his time at the Sick Kids, thanks to the amazing hospital staff and Edinburgh Children's Hospital Charity. ECHC brings that extra special element that makes all the difference."









Morrisons - Helping Patients Like Harris



Thanks to the staff and customers of Morrisons, you will be helping children like Harris.

Harris was born on the 7th April 2014 with two rare genetic disorders (SepBP1 and 3MC) affecting his growth and development.

From November 2019, Harris started to complain of a sore tummy. His stomach pain continued into December and he wasn't his usual happy self.

Harris and dad Peter were blue lighted to Royal Aberdeen Children's Hospital. In January 2020, Harris was diagnosed with a cancerous tumour that develop in the nerve cells running in a chain down the back of the chest and abdomen.

One of the most valued things during this time has been the Archie funded Play Leader Sarah who has been a saviour for Harris.

Archie have also funded meal vouchers for Harris's parents and the Archie funded Wi-Fi has helped keep Harris and his parents connected to friends and family at home
